OUR MISSION

The aim of religious education is to promote communion with Jesus Christ. At St. Joseph Parish, we seek to nurture a faith that is living, conscious, and active in the light of instruction. Our goal is to offer formation to help your family live in a way that is faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the tradition of the Catholic Church. Our work involves catechetics (instruction in the faith), opportunities for service, sacramental preparation, and appreciation for public prayer and worship, fellowship, and spiritual renewal.

THE WAY OUR PROGRAM WORKS

We strive to provide a comprehensive faith formation program for children beginning with children in Grade 1. The children are instructed by a dedicated team of volunteer catechists who strive to be good adult role models. They provide a loving, Christian atmosphere within the classroom so that the children will be able to grow in their faith and develop a strong Catholic identity. The shared catechetical process between the catechist, church community and family is designed to nurture each child in his or her life-long faith journey.

We strive to enhance faith formation by encompassing the six fundamental tasks of catechesis:

1. Promoting knowledge of the faith;
2. Liturgical education;
3. Moral formation;
4. Teaching prayer;
5. Education for community life;
6. Create and stimulate a missionary spirit

Children in Grade 1 participate in a home program (one on one) with their parents and attend monthly Activity Sessions at the school.

Grades 2 -7 attend weekly class on Tuesday or Wednesday from October through April.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Sacrament preparation is a parish based program. Children who are attending either a Catholic school OR the St Joseph Parish Religious Education Program are eligible to enroll in this process of preparation.

- **SACRAMENTS OF FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST EUCHARIST**

Preparation begins no earlier than the second year of regular grade level religious education classes.

- **SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**

Students entering Grade 6 are eligible to enroll in the 2-year Confirmation Program. Students participate in final preparation activities and celebrate Confirmation in the fall of Grade 8.

Grades 8-12 students who have not attended regular grade level classes and would like to celebrate the initiation sacraments are welcome to enroll in the program.

CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

It is our commitment to make our programs inclusive and accessible to children with special needs and disabilities. Parents are the most knowledgeable about their own children. Please inform us of any special circumstances your child or family may have so that we can make arrangements that meet their needs.

BECOME A CATECHIST!

We have a continuous need for catechists (religion teachers) in order for our program to be sustained and grow. We invite and encourage parents, grandparents, and parishioners to consider joining our ministry. It is only with your help and participation that that we can accomplish the task of passing on our faith to the children. Catechists are responsible for planning and carrying out the designated curriculum. We invite you to prayerfully consider joining this ministry.
